SPHERE's Community Advisory Committee (to right) convened in

February for the first time at the Azrieli Faculty of Medicine. The committee consists of religious leaders and representatives of Kupot Holim, industry, social services, the education system and Galilee non-profits. The committee will prioritize SPHERE's current and future activities and will also evaluate the progress of the project.



- SPHERE published the results of a study by Prof. Naim Shehadeh on childhood obesity. The study confirmed that children with a higher BMI are at an increased risk for cardiovascular disease, liver disease and diabetes.
- SPHERE published the Call for Abstracts for the first SPHERE conference, taking place on May 3, 2023 in Nazareth. Dr. Ron Piran will lead the session on basic science related to diabetes and obesity.
- On Monday March 13, 2023, together with the NGO Nova Project, SPHERE started training the Health Coordinators in Nazareth, Nof HaGalil, Safed, Sachnin and Shfar'am in the use of data for the development of their municipal health strategy and specific interventions. The SPHERE municipal health dashboard combines data from the municipalities with data from the HMOs and other sources, providing unprecedented insight in health problems within in the cities.
- On Wednesday March 15, SPHERE and Maccabi launched the "Pre-diabetes" program. Students from the Azrieli Faculty of Medicine are matched with family physicians of Maccabi to jointly provide 500 identified patients with the care they need to avoid progression to diabetes.

MEET OUR PHD STUDENT SHIR GALIN

This month we would like to introduce you to Shir Galin, a doctoral student in Dr. Hanna Keren's HAC-K (Human Artificial Control-Keren) lab. Shir writes:

I am currently studying for a doctorate while also working as a medical psychologist, coordinating the medical psychological service at Ziv Hospital in Safed.

Since my undergraduate studies I have enjoyed research. After my bachelors degree in psychology, I had to choose whether to continue for a research only degree, or a clinical therapeutic degree where it was possible to combine research but on a small scale. I chose the therapeutic field, but I tried to integrate research into my work at the hospital.

Then came the Corona virus.

At the beginning of the Corona epidemic, information about the disease was still limited. The hospital was emptied of patients, who were afraid of being infected. After a short period, the disease began to spread, and the hospital's Corona wards were filled with patients struggling to breathe. This was the first time I conducted psychological treatment with the patient and me being separated by a white nylon protective suit, goggles and gloves. The patient did not see me, and I had difficulty hearing him. During this period I faced difficult and heartbreaking cases. Patients fought for their lives with great bravery, but too often, succumbed to a cruel disease, which advanced at record speed. A large proportion of the patients were middle-aged people. Just a week or two earlier they were leading productive and healthy lives, raising their teenage children, and going to work.

I did my specialization in psychology, among other places, in a pain clinic. There the mind-body connection is very prominent – the way in which physical pain promotes and affects mental pain, but, even more so, how mental pain promotes and intensifies physical pain. Even in the Corona department, the mind-body connection stood out. Patients in acute physical distress suffered from lifethreatening anxiety, but the impression was that anxiety and depression contributed to the worsening of the physical condition.

I have joined the laboratory of Dr. Hanna Keren. I am happy to research, among other things, mind-body connections and psychosomatic phenomena. The goals of the laboratory are to understand, measure, and control emotions and mood, using the power of technology and advanced engineering. The technology we are developing could eventually help improve mood and mental well-being and lead to new individualized treatments for depression and other psychopathologies. In the lab I am studying areas I have never dealt with before, such as programming and data processing, while trying to contribute the clinical knowledge I have gained to our research. This work in the laboratory perfectly combines my two areas of interest – the therapeutic and research.
